

Door Panel Instructions

All Door Panels ship with the material covering one side of the door panel without cut outs. The back side of the door panel board has perforated opening locations for such things as door handles, window cranks, electric windows, pull straps, etc.

It is the responsibility of the consumer to remove whatever perforated openings that are pertinent to your vehicle.

Once the openings required are removed then the material needs to be cut to accommodate the part that needs to go into the opening.

This is done by using a razor blade or razor knife and cutting an “X” cut through the material in the center of the opening. Please be careful not to cut the “X” all the way to the edge of the opening in the board. It is suggested to leave $\frac{1}{4}$ ” of material inside the opening so it looks clean when the material is folded back.

After the “X” cut is made then you can fold back the material so you can install door handles, pull straps, etc.

If you want to, you can tape or glue the flaps of material to the backside of the board but, it isn't necessary as once the hardware is installed and the door panel installed, you'll never see the loose material.
